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




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





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

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SCHEME: Flow of objects



1) Chinese objects:

- a) Made in China (= location was part of the Chinese state at the time of object's production)
- b) Made by Han Chinese overseas (including in Europe and European colonies, i.e. Hong Kong under British rule)
- 2) China-related objects (semi)-products produced in China to be processed abroad)
- 3) Documentation of networks that enable the flow of objects (cf. flow of people)
